Before You Go

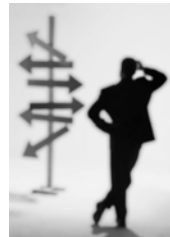
- When packing remember that you will have to carry everything on your back. Be sensible
- Good walking boots, dark comfortable clothes (less washing), rain gear.

Safety Issues

- Keep passport, insurance information, ID, and inter-rail ticket with you at all times.
- Handy tip—Keep these in a money belt which can be strapped to your body underneath your clothes. Then, use a bum-bag as a decoy for potential pickpockets.
- Ring home often and give someone a general idea of your travel plans.

Train Journey

- Traveling by train by night cuts your accommodation expenses and allows you to spend your days exploring the city.
- Be sure you have paid any necessary train supplement or you may be fined.
- Bring your own food and drink on the train—it's much cheaper!!

Some useful tips for Inter-railing.

Essentials

- A sturdy rucksack with padded shoulder pads
- Make sure you are insured: Travel & Health
- E111 card for EU medical cover
- Money: Work a daily budget and try to stick to it as much as possible. Do some research to find out how much it would cost to eat and sleep in each country before you go.
- First Aid: Include band aids, stomach tablets, sun block etc.

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
